NO ONE DOES MORE FOR VETERANS.

Post Member Bio - Lisa Love



When I was a senior in high school, all I knew was I wanted to get away from Clawson. I'd already been accepted at a college in Ohio where I planned to major in equestrian studies (to be a horse trainer) - until I saw a Navy recruiter at school. That totally changed my plans! In March 1992, I went to bootcamp in Orlando then to cryptologic school in Pensacola, FL. I ended up dropping out of school and went to my first ship in Kings Bay, GA. I was on the submarine tender USS Canopus AS34 from September 1992 until it was decommissioned in November 1994. I started out in the deck department, chipping & painting, then transferred

into the post office. In December 1994, I was among the first group of females to be stationed on an aircraft carrier. I made E4 shortly after arriving onboard USS Abraham Lincoln CVN72. We went on WestPac in April 1995 and I got to visit Hong Kong, Singapore and Jebel Ali in the Persian Gulf. While we were in the Gulf, I was sent to Dubai for 6 weeks, then Diego Garcia to work in the airport, loading mail onto planes & helicopters to be sent out to the US battle group. We missed out on going to Australia & New Zealand - thanks to Saddam Hussein - we had to stay in the Gulf until the next carrier group arrived. After WestPac, the Lincoln moved from Alameda, CA to Bremerton. WA to go into yards for overhaul. I made E5 on my first attempt, earned my Enlisted Aviation Warfare Specialist pin and also re-enlisted between the rudders while she was in drydock. In February 1997, I was expecting my daughter, so they cut my sea-time short and I transferred to the mailroom at Naval Station Everett, WA. I stayed there until March 2000 and I moved back here to Michigan. I have worked at a trucking company since May 2000 and have volunteered for Lapeer County Search & Rescue since February 2018, which is also the same time I joined the VFW! I'm married, have one daughter, 2 grandkids & 3 cats.
