If you know a Veteran who would like to join or a Post member that has passed, please call me (586) 291-9914. Please remember and share that we have an Honor Guard to support and honor our Veterans.

There are three qualifiers for membership in the VFW, as set out in our National Bylaws. An individual must meet all three in order to become a member. They are as follows

- 1: **Citizenship** must be a U.S. citizen or U.S. National.
- 2: **Honorable Service** must have served in the Armed Forces of the United States and either received a discharge of Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) or be currently serving.
- 3: Service in a war, campaign, or expedition on foreign soil or in hostile waters\*. This can be proven by any of the following:
- An authorized campaign medal Receipt of Hostile Fire Pay or Imminent Danger Pay (verified by a military pay statement)
- Service in Korea for 30 consecutive or 60 non-consecutive days

\*This information is available through a veteran's DD-214. If other information is needed or if a veteran's DD-214 is not complete, they can <u>contact the National Personnel Records Center online</u> or at 314-801-0800 to request more information.

If you are not eligible for membership in the Veterans of Foreign Wars but you have a parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, sibling, or spouse who would be eligible then you may apply for membership in the VFW Auxiliary. You can learn more at vfwauxiliary.org.

# Scholarships

Congratulations to Zachary Brown from Rochester Adams High School for being one of our Carl F. LaRock Scholarship winners this year! Zachary is going to Florida State University in the fall and definitely appreciates the \$1000, courtesy of Comrade LaRock's legacy!

This scholarship is named after PFC Carl F. LaRock (Nov. 2, 1909 – May 24, 1994,) who served in the U.S. Army as an anti-aircraft artillery gun crewman from July 29, 1943, thru Dec 23, 1945.

When Carl passed away he donated more than \$62,000 to the Old Settlers Post 4659. Through a vote of the membership, \$12,000 went toward building the memorial and flagpole out in front of the post and the balance became the Carl F. LaRock Memorial Scholarship.

The LaRock Scholarship is open to all high school seniors in the Shelby Township area (Utica / Stevenson / Eisenhower / Ford II / Lutheran North / UAIS) and graduates of these schools under the age of 21, who have a letter of acceptance from any college, university, or trade school.

Veterans, children, and grandchildren of Old Settler's Post 4659 members, regardless of residence, who meet all other criteria are also able to apply. A minimum GPA of 3.0 is required and veterans, children, and grandchildren of any veteran will get an extra .25 added to their GPA.

# Quartermasters Corner

#### Military Personnel and Retirement the VFW's Concerns:

The VFW has long argued that Department of Defense (DOD) retired pay and Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) service-connected disability compensation are fundamentally different benefits, earned for different reasons. Military retired pay is earned by 20 or more years of service in the United States Armed Forces, allowing retirees to maintain their standard of living while attempting to enter the civilian job market for the first time in the middle of their prime working years.

Service-connected disability compensation is a benefit meant to supplement a veteran's lost earning potential as a result of the disabilities he or she incurred while in service. However, military retirees who are less than 50 percent service-connected disabled are required to offset their retiree pay with the amount of VA disability compensation they receive. Also, Chapter 61 retirees who were medically retired with less than 20 years of military service face the same dollar-for-dollar offset. As a result, some disability retirees are separated before becoming eligible for Longevity retirement, while others have completed 20 or more years of service.

As of 2020, there are 575,476 Chapter 61 retirees—more than 42,000 of whom have been medically discharged due to combat-related injuries, and unjustly denied the benefits they deserve. In 1996, the Military Housing Privatization Initiative (MHPI) began as a result of DOD's struggle to build and maintain adequate housing.


However, in the past few years, the MHPI program has been plagued with widespread complaints of neglected or careless repairs and unsafe conditions. Residents have been exposed to high levels of toxins and environmental Residents have, lead-based paint, asbestos, Residents have, and sewage. Maintenance issues have gone unresolved since privatized housing companies have strong financial incentives not to hold units vacant for lengthy repairs or renovations.

In response, DOD implemented a bill of rights to ensure tenants receive quality housing and fair treatment from the private housing companies. Nevertheless, before service members move to a new base, they are not given access to historical maintenance records about their new homes, which is inconsistent with standard practice for all new home buyers in the United States.

As a result, the VFW proposes that DOD develop base housing comparison tool to beat central information center for service members. Based on the model of the GI Bill Comparison Tool, it would provide access to information about the base sand private housing private housing service members make informed decisions about whether to live on or off base. Additionally, it would allow oversight of the housing situation at each base around the country, so problems could be addressed in an appropriate and timely manner.

The VFW calls on Congress to direct DOD to develop and implement a comparison tool for base housing. The VFW's Solutions: Congress must pass the Major Richard pass that would enable Chapter 61 veterans discharged due to combatrelated injuries to be entitled to DOD longevity payment and VA disability compensation without offset. Congress must enact legislation to implement a new online comparison tool for service members, and to serve as a central information center for oversight. Call your Congressmen


