Post and Auxiliary members receive our newsletter in the mail, but are not always able to attend a meeting. With that in mind, I would like to highlight some of the National Programs that we, as an Auxiliary, promote within our community, and discuss at meetings. You are familiar with the Scholarships program since there is a separate article in each newsletter, but did you know there is an Americanism Program? The goals of the Americanism Program are Flag Education, Promoting Patriotism, and POW/MIA Recognition. Our task is, in conjunction with our Post, to ensure that our community is aware of all aspects of the mentioned goals. This is why we participate in parades and celebrate patriotic holidays.

The next Program is "Buddy" Poppy / National Home. The goals for this Program are to educate the public by distributing the poppies. The VFW has been distributing poppies for 95 years as a tribute to our veterans. In 1924, the VFW registered the name "Buddy" Poppy with the US Patent Office. A Certificate issued on May 22, 1924 granted the VFW all trademark rights in the name of "Buddy" under classification of artificial flowers. No other organization or individual can legally use the name "Buddy" Poppy. The Post and Auxiliary will accept donations for the poppies. We use the proceeds from the poppies to aid our Veterans. We use the poppies in decorative centerpieces, and corsages and, enter the displays in statewide contests for the Department Auxiliary.

For more than 90 years, the VFW National Home for Children located in Eaton Rapids, Michigan, has helped military and veteran families who need a fresh start. The National Home has 42 family homes on streets lined with trees. It has facilities such as a gym, library, computer and science labs, day care center, playgrounds, fishing pond, hiking trails, and more! It keeps families together in their time of need. We are proud to contribute to the success of the National Home and their residents. Tours are available by contacting the Home.

I am looking forward to reporting to you on all of our programs in upcoming newsletter articles. Each of our programs has an auxiliary chairman who provides the available information at our meetings. Please visit the Department of Michigan Auxiliary website at www.vfwauxmi.org to review each of the programs. Working these programs allows us to be an integral part of our community.


