
Thank you for re-electing me as your 2024-25 Commander. I appreciate the confidence you have shown me. I will try to live up to your expectations!

Through his years of service, from earning the rank of LCpL to achieving the rank of Major, Gene dedicated himself to upholding justice and protecting the values he holds dear. Each milestone, from earning his BA degree in criminal justice to obtaining an MBA,

was a testament to his unwavering determination and resilience. He was deployed across 5 continents, 6 of the 7 seas, and an unspecified number of countries with the brotherhood of arms with which he still enjoys a rich network of meaningful connections.

His leadership skills also flourished as Director of Operations, where he guided a global team of 1,200 colleagues across 21 time zones, ensuring smooth service and repair of heavy combat equipment.

Gene's commitment to service didn't stop there. After his second retirement, he dedicated himself to his community. He actively volunteered in Shelby Township's Solid Waste and Recycling Committee, as well as the Planning Commission, shaping responsible practices for the future. He currently serves on the board of directors for the USMC Tankers Association, fostering camaraderie and supporting fellow veterans. He also proudly serves as a member of the VFW Post 4659 Honor Guard, paying "Honors" to fallen heroes.

When not volunteering, he enjoys traveling with his wife, spending time with his grandsons, fishing and hunting with friends, playing cards, and hitting the gym for some PT.


We're open 1-9 every day, except Monday when we're closed for maintenance.




