Comrades and Auxiliary Members,

On August 30th I traveled to Traverse City to attend a House of Representatives Veterans Affairs Satellite Subcommittee Meeting chaired by Michigan's 1st District U.S. Congressman Jack Bergman. The subject of the meeting was something some of our members may find interesting. For those that have difficulty traveling to their Medical

Appointments, the VA has established the VA telehealth program. If accepted by the program, a veteran may be issued equipment to check and report their Blood pressure, Blood oxygen, etc. and send and receive information and answers to important questions The veteran may enroll to do these and other functions over the internet. If the veteran does not have a connected computer, they can be issued a connected tablet to be used for this function. This can eliminate the need for the veteran to travel to Detroit, Ann Arbor or other VA Medical Centers. This will not eliminate all visits, but should be helpful to many of our members using the VA Healthcare system.

I will be in Washington DC from September 11-14 as a member of the VFW National Legislative Committee to attend our annual fall Legislative Conference representing Michigan. This gives us another opportunity to visit the offices of our U.S. Senators and Congress Members to pass along information on our National Legislative Priority Goals. We work hard to form these relationships to further those Veteran Healthcare and National Security Issues as directed through resolutions passed by the delegates at our VFW National Convention. Being on the Legislative Committee for 15 years and with 26 years of attendance at the Spring Legislative Conference and having been to DC about 50 times over those years, those relationships are getting stronger with each visit. It is all a bit hectic, but it is what I do and it is important.

If you want to be part of the legislative activity of the VFW, go on the internet to vfw.org Click on Advocacy, Click on Grass Roots Efforts and click on Join VFW Action Corps. Fill out the application and you are in. You will receive weekly Action Corps updates and as needed Action Alerts that you are encouraged to act take action on.

We are accepting entries to our VFW High School Voice of Democracy Audio Scriptwriting and Patriot's Pen Middle School essay programs. If you need an application for either competition. Give a call to me at 586-322-3304 or call the Post 586-781-9109 where applications will be available for you.

In closing, I ask that you locate and pass along to me a prospective New Member for our Post. 

Can The New Decision Ready Claims Process Work For You?

Today the VA announced their new Decision Ready Claim (DRC) initiative which they say promises to deliver faster disability claim decisions to veterans. In fact, their press release says that "veterans who choose to submit their claim under DRC can expect to receive a decision within 30 days from the time VA receives the claim."

To those of us who waited months or years for the VA to make a decision on a disability claim this sounds too good to be true. Let's check out the details to see if this is as good as it sounds.

Types Of Disability Claims

Normally there are 3 types of disability claims veterans file with the VA:

- 1. A pre-discharge claim, submitted before leaving active duty. This can speed up receipt of benefits.
- 2. An initial claim for disability submitted after leaving the service. This makes up the majority of VA's disability claims.
- 3. A claim for an increase in and existing disability. This amounts for about 30% of all the disability claims.

We at VFW shall watch closely to see what happens and respond accordingly.
