Two New Veterans homes for Michigan!

LANSING, Mich. — The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs authorized funding from the VA State Veterans Home Construction Grant Program to build two new veterans homes in Grand Rapids and Southeast Michigan. According to the priority list released this morning, the VA has authorized up to \$123 million for the projects.


"This is great news for our state's veterans," said Gov. Rick Snyder. "I am pleased Michigan gained the support from the federal VA with this grant funding for two veterans homes. It will pave the way for new, modern facilities that are long overdue and will better meet the needs of our veterans. Our brave men and women who served our state and nation deserve the absolute best, and I am proud of the work that is being done to help make Michigan the best place for veterans to live, raise a family, work and retire." In 2016, the Michigan Legislature approved \$42 million in state funds for the projects. The VA State Home Construction Grant Program provides up to 65 percent funding for approved projects and has authorized up to \$38 million for Grand Rapids and up to \$42 million for Southeast Michigan.

A plan to modernize long-term health care for the state's veterans was created by a workgroup convened by the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency to study best practices and chart a path to modernize state run facilities providing long-term care to veterans. The workgroup comprised of health care and financial experts and legislators completed their report in August 2016, recommending application to the VA State Veteran Home Construction Grant Program to build up to seven new veterans homes across the state. Based on recommendations from the group and with strong bi-partisan support from the legislature, Governor Rick Snyder signed into law PA 560 of 2016, creating the Michigan Veterans' Facilities Authority, governed by a nine member board. The first action of the Authority Board was approval of the grant application designating that the first two homes be built on the current 90 acre campus in Grand Rapids and on a site to be determined in Southeast Michigan.

"We appreciate VA's support of Michigan's veterans in announcing this much needed funding to build new, modern veterans homes in our state," said Michigan Veterans Facility Chair/Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency Director James Robert Redford. "This is an important first step that allows Michigan to continue providing veteran-centered care in a modern, home-like setting, eventually expanding the number of veteran homes across the state in order to serve veterans close to where they live."

The Michigan Veterans Facility Authority Board of Directors continues work to finalize site selection in southeast Michigan, based on legislative direction to locate a new state veterans home in Michigan Prosperity Region 10. The board has a goal of beginning construction of the new facility in Grand Rapids in September 2018.

The following article 1st appeared in Military.com on line news. If you are paying for Survivor Benefit Plan this may effect you.

Defense Finance & Accounting Service (DFAS) is saying that many retirees who have VA pay their full or partial Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) payment may be getting an erroneous bill from the Treasury Department. Currently, there are four methods of paying for your SBP coverage:

- Deductions from your retired pay
- Deductions from your CRSC Pay
- Deductions from your VA pay
- Direct remittance
- Paid Up Status

A change in the billing agency from DFAS to the Department of the Treasury Centralized Receivables Service is the cause of the mix-up. Previously DFAS sent the monthly bills to those who choose direct remittance as their payment method, or those whose VA pay isn't enough to cover the monthly SBP premium. Unless you have made a change to your VA remittance for your monthly SBP premium, VA will still pay your recurring monthly premium amount (whether that is the full or a partial amount), so you don't need to pay the monthly premium amount shown on the Centralized Receivables Service bill. DFAS and VA are working with the Treasury to fix the problem, but DFAS warns that you may get an erroneous bill next month as well. In April of this year a new law went into effect requiring DFAS to deduct SBP premiums from CRSC pay. There is no indication that this issue is related to that change.If you have any questions, you should contact DFAS directly at 800-321-1080 M - F 8 AM - 5 PM Eastern.
